Jittipat Poonkham (PhD Aberystwyth University; MPhil Oxford University) is Associate Dean for Academic and International Affairs, Director of International Studies Program, and Associate Professor of International Relations in the Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University. At the regional level, he is the Thai representative to the ASEAN Regional Forum Expert and Eminent Persons (ARF EEPs). Jittipat is also an Adjunct Fellow at the International Studies Center (ISC), the Thai Ministry of Foreign Affairs think tank.

His research interests include international relations theories, geopolitics and great power politics, Indo-Pacific power dynamics and Thai foreign policy. He is an author of *A Genealogy of Bamboo Diplomacy: The Politics of Thai Détente with Russia and China* (ANU Press, 2022) and a co-editor of *International Relations as a Discipline in Thailand: Theory and Sub-fields* (Routledge, 2019). Currently, Jittipat is an Associate Editor of *International Relations*, published by SAGE Publications and on the editorial board member of *Review of International Studies*.
